Three groups spend other people's money: children, politicians and thieves. All three demand very close supervision.

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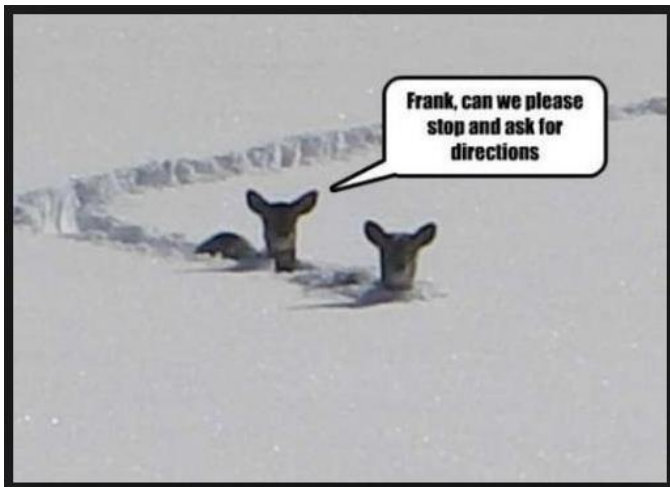
My husband and I took our two-year-old daughter to the home-improvement store.

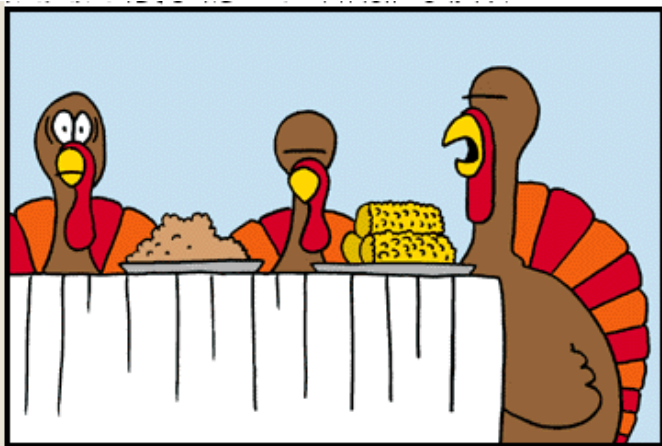
