The man on the camel said "No, but if you like, I have a nice selection of ties. Would you like to buy one?"

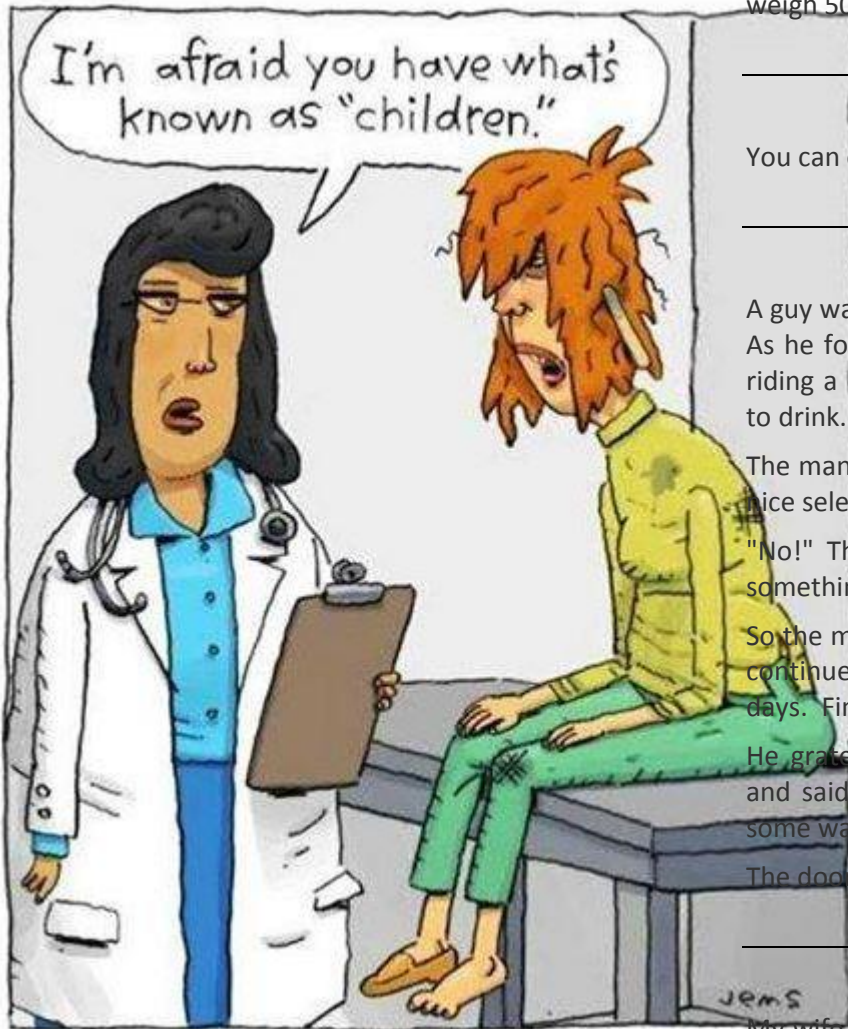
"No!" The first man replied. "Are you crazy? I need something to drink, not a tie!"
