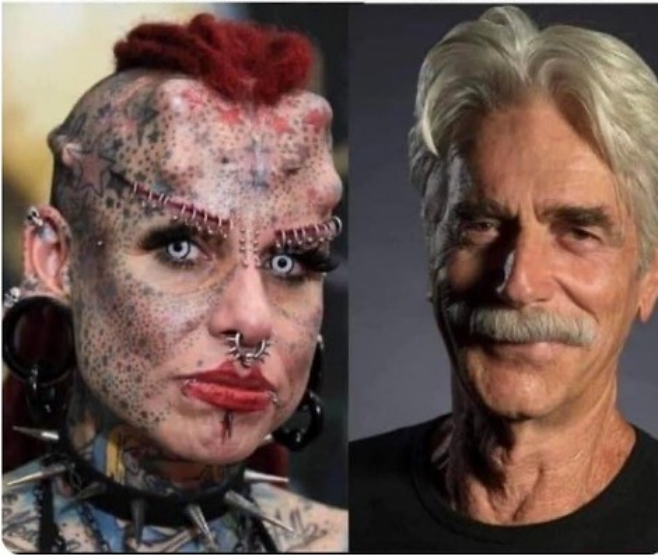
I was too tired to respond, so I just ignored them until I heard the second girl ask the first, "How do you know that woman is somebody's mom?"

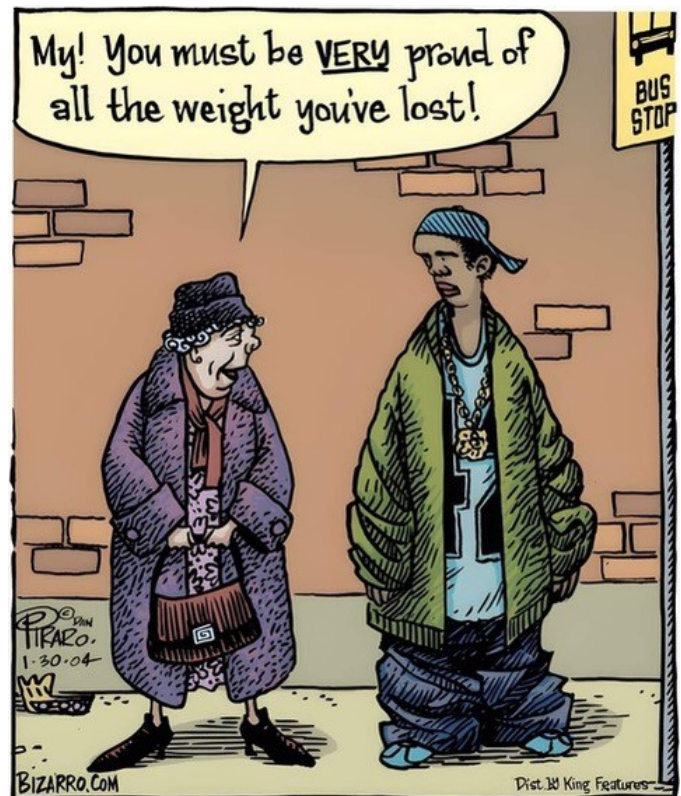

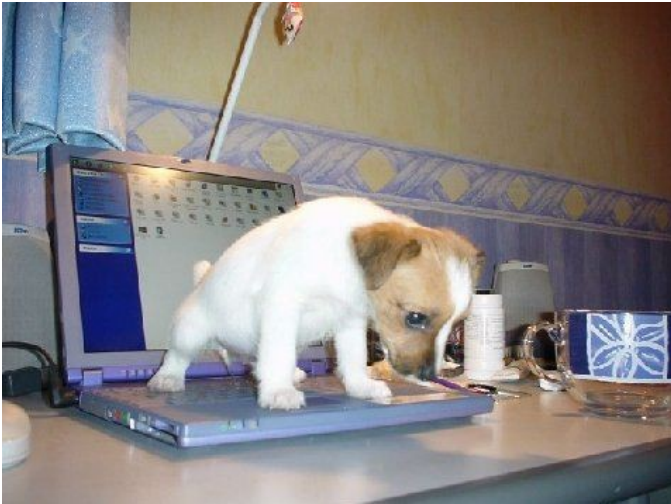
Ground control receives her call for help and answers back: "Don't worry, madam. I'll talk you down, just do as I say. First, I need you to give me your height and position."

Nothing is as inevitable as a mistake whose time has come.--Tussman's Law

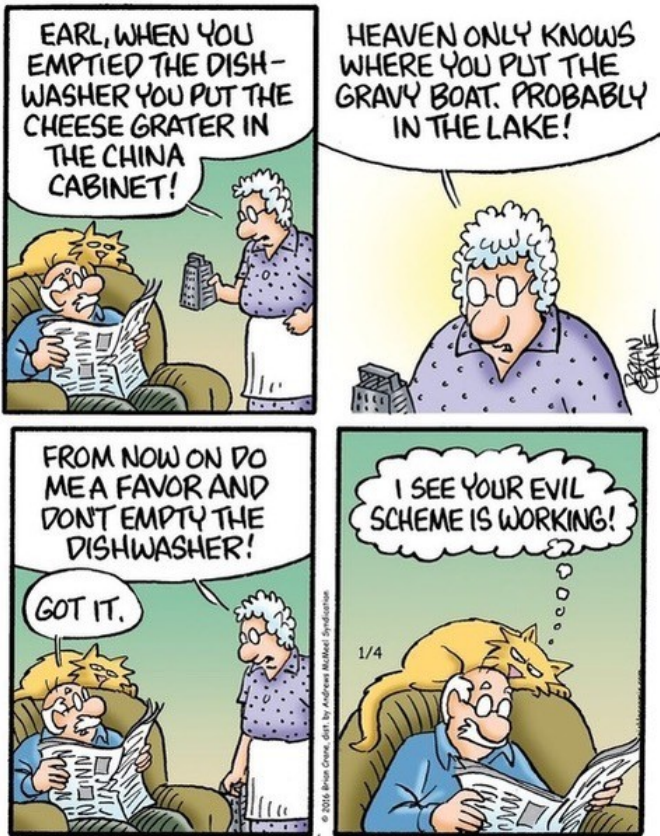
